For the uninitiated the Bonesaw Tour has rapidly evolved and expanded into something not even I can control. The cat is out of the bag and you can't put that toothpaste back in the tube. So we gathered together to create an opportunity to invite more sick bros to see what we've built and to participate. This event will be the first open invitational event where Tour members may invite 1 or more guests to compete. The stakes are massive, as the top 4 amateurs on tour will earn a tour card granting them not just a luxurious status among friends and family. but also an automatic invitation to the J6 Major (tentatively planned for Lake Jovita) but also 2 more majors next year, AND a chance to be on our Ryder Cup team as we take on the BGA tour summer 2024. Without that qualification, you may be left out to hang. So let those stakes marinate... This event matters.

The rules are simple, Bogey = 1 point, Par = 2points, Birdie = 4 points, Eagle = 8 points. Each player will be assigned a quota based on their handicap and powerful AI, combined with a patented algorithm.

Each player starts the round in the negative of their quota. So if you are a 25 quota, you start the round at (-25). Your goal is to have the best score in relation to your quota. So if a 10 quota scores 10 points (0) that's better than a 12 quota scoring 11 points (-11). The main benefit of the format is it allows players to not lose points at any point in the round, and keeps pace of play moving. The birdie bonus is also nice in that it rewards an excellent hole and allows players to get back in the game. In order to get a point that ball MUST go in the cup. Absolutely ZERO gimmies allowed. I don't care if it's 2 inches a way and you casually back

hand the putt in and miss, that is a stroke.

We play standard BSGA rules, which is like the USGA but with 1 main exceptions.

 If a ball goes out of bounds as designated by white stakes, the player is allowed to take stroke and distance like it was a red stake, but MUST take a penalty stroke and drop in the field of play.

At the end of the round players are encouraged to hang in the clubhouse for the award ceremony and develop even more camaraderie. I look forward to hosting you all.



#### **2024 AND BEYOND**



Currently for the 2024 season we have 4 majors, 1 qualifier, and Ryder cup event slated. Lessons have been learned and will be implemented in the running of these events and they will only get better. Additionally, we are in talks with the Crist Family foundation for sanctioned tour event (Cristy's Countryside Classic (™)), and I am optimistic I will find another tour member to host their own event that will become a staple for years to come. That would put us at 8 events on the year and be a massive boost to our credibility as a tour and set a new standard from which we will only improve to serve you even better.

### Ryder Cup 2024

I must confess, the idea for this tour did not emerge solely from my own brain. Alas, it was inspired by a tour that many of us BSGA tour members have begrudgingly participated in; The BGA. It's a group of washed up former Noles who have lost their passion for their own tour and are eager for a spark, much like a saddened couple who have long lost the flame and are running through the motions at this point.
