I immediately began phoning in my contacts at courses, Wentworth, Crescent Oaks, Cypress Run, the entire gauntlet. When lo and behold, the GM at Plantation Palms stepped up with an offer I couldn't refuse, and thus the new host was decided.

On J6 we will be playing Plantation Palms for 36 holes starting at 7 AM (Opie will be in final group don't worry), for a tidy sum of only \$80/player INCLUDING range balls. After some backroom deals and negotiations, I was able to secure the best package possible for my players, whomst my representation responsibilities I do not take lightly.

That said, the compromise has been struck amongst the bourgeois of the tour to make a return to LJ, but this time in the summer for the Bonesaw Open, which sports a 36 hole day followed by an 18 hole championship final round. Rest assured, this was the best possible outcome the Commish could have secured, and he continues to work round the clock on your behalf.
